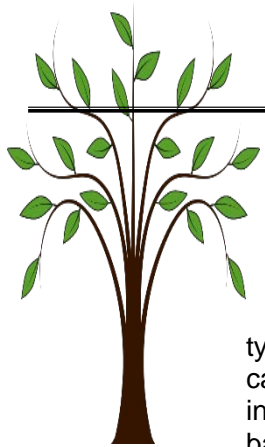

News from the Wando Woods Garden Club By Nancy Wooldridge

I said last month that we are going to talk about roses. As I have told you before, I am not the expert, but I have good resources and I am willing to share them. Now, **if you attend the Wando Woods Craft Fair on Oct. 29th, one of the books I use for reference will be for sale.**

About Roses – It is important to always buy the best quality from a good, reliable source. The types of roses for Charleston are shrub roses. The most popular of these is the *Knock-Out Rose*. It can be planted in mass, requires very little maintenance, and blooms for extended periods. It comes in single or double blooms. A good example of these roses can be seen at International Blvd., at the base of the Mark Clark overpass.

Hybrid Tea are the classic long stem roses, and they bloom for a long time with little maintenance. They also come in single or double blooms. They are coveted for their long vase life, and are beautiful in floral arrangements. Older **Garden Roses** are the ones that have been around for a long time. Some are spring bloomers only, and others are perpetual; most are fragrant. A good example of these is the *Davis Austin*, which combine both form and fragrance.

The **Noisette** Rose holds a special place here, as it was developed here and is the first class of rose to originate in the US. They are attractive for landscaping, requiring low maintenance and resistance to diseases, and are more tolerant of heat and drought than other roses. Some good examples of these are: *Lady Banksia*, developed 1796-1870; and *Bourbon (Souvenir de la malmaison)*, developed 1843. One of this type grows into a 3-foot bush, and the other is a climber. Then, we have the bush type, parent of the Noisette Class, *China Old Blush*, 1752. *Ducher*, 1869, and *Louis Philippe*, 1834, are examples of old roses still growing in local nurseries.

We also have **Hybrid Musk**, 1919-1939, which grow as climbers or large bushes. One of the parents of the Noisette Class is a *Mush, R. Moschata*, 1540. The **Noisettes**, 1817-1879, are fragrant white, yellow, and pink climbers. They grow wild in the woods around old homesteads.

Next month, we will talk about planting, care, and pruning. Come to the Craft Fair on October 29th and buy the book. Then you will know everything and more!
